Ryde Rowing Club is one of the Islands oldest Sports Clubs having been in continuous existence, providing facilities for competitive and recreational rowing as well as social facilities for its members since at least 1877.

The Clubhouse in Appley Park provides boat storage, training area, men's and ladies changing facilities with showers as well as club rooms, licensed members bar and facilities for meetings, conferences etc.. The clubroom is available for members parties, weddings etc.. and the club stages a range of social events for its members. The Clubhouse has full disabled access, including ramp, stairlift and disabled toilets.

Membership is open to all, subject to the completion of the application form, payment of the appropriate subscription and acceptance by the Clubs general committee. Ryde Rowing Club - A Brief History.

A Rowing Club existed in Ryde before the foundation of our Club in 1877. It is clear that a Ryde Working Men's Rowing Club was founded in 1861. It would appear that the Club split in 1877 – into Ryde Rowing Club and Ryde Working Men's Club – which eventually became the Vectis Fishing and Boating Club. Presumably the split was bought about by the divergence of "rowing" and "fishing"! It is clear that the two clubs shared a boathouse on the pier from at least 1887 as on 30th June that year the Ryde Working Men's Club subscribed £75 to Ryde Rowing Club being the amount agreed towards expenses of boathouse and slipway on pier. Thereafter they paid £7-£10 per 1/2 year for rent. So while we have long believed that Ryde Rowing Club are the "youngest" of the three existing IW Clubs (Newport, 1863 and Shanklin Sandown, 1871) it

is likely that Ryde are in fact, arguably the oldest Club – having emerged from the Ryde Working Men's Rowing Club founded in 1861! Ryde Rowing Club was founded in 1877 and is the only Isle of Wight based Rowing Club that has been in continuous existence ever since. It is believed to be one of the oldest sporting clubs in Ryde. The original Clubhouse was on Ryde Pier from where it carried out its competitive rowing and social activities until 1968 when the then landlords, British Rail, evicted the Club on the grounds that the pillars on which the Clubhouse was built were in a dangerous condition and beyond economic repair - these pillars can still be seen standing today, over 50 years later! Thanks to the old Ryde Borough Council the Club were rehoused in temporary accommodation in Appley Park which consisted of a Boathouse only, with no changing or social facilities. In spite of this the Club experienced some of its most successful seasons on the water and laid down the foundations for the even more successful years that were to follow. Thanks to further support from the Local Authority, Sports Council grant aid and a major fundraising effort by the members, a new clubhouse was opened in 1975. Still in Appley Park, Ryde, this provided changing and social facilities in addition to a boathouse. With new premises, the Club experienced a period of growth and significant improvement in performance, with a number of Hants & Dorset and South Coast Championships won and qualification for Henley on two occasions. In the mid 1990's a further problem developed with the Clubhouse suffering from major subsidence believed to be as a result of the construction of a sewage treatment works behind the building, for which the Club was not insured. As a result, a successful application was made to the Sports Aid Foundation and the National Lottery Sports Fund. This enabled the Club to rebuild a new two story Clubhouse, with much improved facilities, which opened in 1998. For a small Isle of Wight based Rowing Club, Ryde have an impressive record in the South Coast Rowing Championships since winning their first Championship event in 1978. Following on from this initial success they have won a further seventeen South Coast Championships – eighteen in total - and numerous Open and Invitation events - including the aggregate trophy for best performing Club in the Open and Invitation events at a Regatta on five occasions. Crews from Ryde have represented their Association on thirty-eight occasions and are best remembered for the outstanding achievement of the Men's Senior Four who won the prestigious Bideford Bowl, for the South Coast Senior Men's Championship three times in a row between 1985 and 1987 with, apart from the coxswain, an unchanged crew. In the same period this crew also won the Hants & Dorset Senior Championship three times. The Club has won forty-one Hants &

Dorset Championships since its first in 1962 – including four consecutive Mens Senior Sculls titles between 2004 and 2007 by Nick Pike.

Two members of Ryde have gone on to row for their country, Martin Knight representing Great Britain in the Men's coxless four at the Olympic Regatta in 1984 and in the Quad Scull in the

World Championships in 1985. More recently Simon Jones, who has won at Henley Royal Regatta with his university and mainland club, has represented Great Britain at under 23 and stoked the GB Lightweight four at the 2005 World Rowing Championships and won a Bronze Medal at the 2007 World Rowing Championships as a member of the GB Men's Lightweight Quad Sculls. The Club are the current record holders for Round the Island Rowing - in a Coxed Coastal Four, in a time of seven hours, fifty-seven minutes, set in 1995 and a coxless Coastal Quad, in a Ryde record time of time of seven hours four minutes, set in 2009. Crews from Ryde have completed the Round the Island Row on thirteen occasions since the first row in 1880 and this includes the only Round the Island row by an all ladies crew in 1999 and by Cub Sculler, Nick Pike, in 2005 in a time of seven hours, fifty-two minutes and ten seconds - the first person to complete the row in a Coastal Single Scull.

The Club has an active Junior Section, recognised by the Sports Governing body, British Rowing, in 2002 when we were awarded BR "Go-Row" status and accredited to run the National Junior Rowing Program. Further recognition followed in 2005 when the Club became the first Rowing Club in the Wessex Region, covering Hampshire, Dorset and the Isle of Wight, and one of the first in the country to be granted Sport England Clubmark status. We are also one of the few Clubs in the Wessex Region with an Adaptive Section. In 2007 the Clubs outstanding contribution within their community was recognised with a National Sports Award when they became the first Rowing Club and the only Island Sports Club to win the prestidigious CCPR Sports Club of the Year Award. The Club was accredited as a BR Explore Rowing Club in 2010 – going on to achieve BR Explore Rowing "Pioneer" status with the IW Rowing Forum – the organisation of Island Rowing Clubs – in 2011.

A Short History of Ryde - with thanks to Ryde Town Council.

The Town on the beach – Easy to reach, hard to equal.

The town of Ryde grew, in Georgian times, from the two small communities of Lower Ryde (down by the shore where boat building and ferrying to and from the mainland were the main activities) and Upper Ryde, whose long street was a drivers road leading to the pasture on the downs and which was bordered by small holdings and farms. In the late 18th century the town developed as a resort for sea bathing and walking. The town's proximity to Portsmouth was convenient for those

who had naval responsibilities. The resident gentry had stylish, new houses which were built incorporating curved glass windows in bowed bays and fine ironwork. Many of these houses can be found in the central Conservation Area and are included in the Town Trail. After Queen Victoria adopted Osborne, a few miles along the coast, as a summer residence so Ryde grew and many of its finest buildings, such as All Saints Church designed by Gilbert Scott, were built to serve the growing population. While leading families commissioned splendid houses, some with beach frontages, the commercial centre of the town grew to offer places of worship, a town hall hostelries, department stores, and an arcade of smaller shops to serve a discerning trade. The building of the Pier and the railway connection opened a regular and reliable contact with the mainland. Ryde has been a destination for famous visitors such as Karl Marx, Oscar Wilde, and many of the crowned heads of Europe. Each year now, as the gateway to the Island, Ryde is the arrival point for more than two million visitors, including thousands on route to the Isle of Wight Festival and Bestival. In 1888 the townspeople of Ryde staged a lamplight procession and carnival parade – the first in the UK (Ryde Rowing Club had a float) a proud tradition that has continued to this day and celebrates 126 years in August. It brings thousands of spectators to the town for parades in early July to coincide with the arts Festival, and for the Grand Finale of all Carnivals on the Island at the end of the summer holidays.

Telephones.

There are telephones in the Ryde Inshore Rescue Headquarters and Ryde Rowing Club. There is an Emergency Telephone outside the Ryde Inshore Rescue Headquarters and there will be a mobile telephone at Regatta Control which is at the start platform.

Launch Rescue Kits.

There will be launch Rescue Kits in the Umpires Boat, at the Start Platform, in the Ryde Inshore Rescue Craft and the Ryde R. C. Launch. Minimum equipment included in the kit is as follows:—Sound signaling device, first aid kit, knife, rope, exposure bags, throw line and life jacket.

Rescue Boats.

The primary rescue service afloat will be provided by Ryde Inshore Rescue who will have up to two fully equipped rescue craft afloat with experienced and qualified crews. Ryde Inshore Rescue will be backed up by the Ryde R. C. Rescue Launch with driver and crew of which at least one will be qualified to a minimum of RYA2. There may be an additional Rescue Launch provided with experienced drivers. NOTE: Ryde Rescue's responsibilities extend beyond Ryde Regatta and they may have to support other incidents unconnected with the Regatta - and may be called away at short notice.


Radio Networks & Communications.

The two Ryde Inshore Rescue Craft will be in radio contact with each other, the Ryde Inshore Rescue Headquarters and Regatta Control. Regatta Control will be in contact with the Umpires boat and this will be a separate channel from the Rescue craft. It is hoped to have but this can not be guaranteed. A back up two way radio will hopefully be available at Regatta Control. The PA system will cover the area from the Regatta Control/Start back towards the Ryde R. C. Clubhouse and should be audible as far as the Appley Park Cafe. Loud Hailers will be available at the Start, Umpires Boat and in the RRC Launch as backup.

First Aid Cover.

Invictus Medical Services Ltd or an alternative provider will be patrolling the Regatta site and will have an Ambulance or Medical Tent near the RRC Clubhouse and foot patrols in attendance and will provide the main first aid cover. There are also first aid facilities at Ryde Inshore Rescue Headquarters with qualified first aider's. First Aid Kits are also available at Regatta Control, the Umpires boats, Ryde R. C. Clubhouse and all Rescue craft including the Ryde R. C. launch.

Emergency Landing.

It is safe to bring boats ashore along most of the length of the course. Areas to be avoided, which are marked on the map are between the Harbour and the pier and by the slipway at the western end of the Canoe Lake. Crews should also watch out for the various groynes that project out from the beach. Particular care should be taken by any crew or sculler who heads towards Ryde Pier and the Harbour. Crews/Scullers should be aware of the Harbour Channel, the Hovercraft manoeuvring area and the small boat anchorage.

EMERGENCY PLAN.

In the event of an emergency situation arising during the Regatta the rescue/emergency services will be coordinated from Regatta Control, which is at the start platform. Regatta Control will have direct communication with the Inshore Rescue, the Ryde R. C. Safety Boat and First Aid Provider and all Club Officials, competitors and spectators via the PA system. Other Rescue Boats will be provided with direct communication if possible. There will be a mobile telephone at Regatta Control that can be used to call for additional assistance or an ambulance or other rescue services as required. The Regatta Controller (S. Bull) will coordinate the rescue, in his absence the Senior Hants & Dorset Official present will act on his behalf and will take control. At all times the opinions and instructions of Ryde Inshore Rescue must be taken into account and acted upon. The Regatta will be suspended if this is considered necessary by the Regatta Controller following consultation with Ryde Inshore Rescue and the Racing Officials if this is appropriate. If the Emergency takes place on the water then the rescue of those involved will be under the complete control of Ryde Inshore Rescue who will coordinate all the rescue activities afloat including the Ryde R. C. Safety boat and any other Rescue Craft available.




